Qualifications needed/routes in

Dentistry students need to complete a five year degree. There are 14 Dental Schools in the UK: you need 5 A*/A grades at GCSE plus 3 A Levels AAA or AAB. Chemistry and Biology A Levels are essential at most Dental schools. Most require you to sit the UCAT—separate admissions test.

Work Experience

Check with each Dental School for details about exactly what they require. Newcastle and Manchester want two weeks which should be carried out in a General Dental Practice, whereas at Leeds they state an "extensive experience in a variety of settings is desirable". At Bristol they want a minimum of 20 days in different fields of Dentistry. Glasgow only want 3 days work shadowing.

Bettering Applications

- 70% of your statement should be on your work experience!
- Read the British Dental Council's publication "Smile"
- Understand the changing role of dental care professionals
- Demonstrate you have evaluated reasons for choosing Dentistry
- Be able to report Dentistry work experience in at least one setting, but extensive experience in a variety of settings is desirable
- Know of current challenges facing the dental profession.

All medical students will need to complete a five year medical degree. It is competitive: you must have a minimum of 5 A*/A (7 or above) grades at GCSE plus 3 A Levels with predicted grades of AAA. Both Chemistry and Biology A Levels are essential at two-thirds of medical schools (see the table for specific info by medical school.) Nearly all medical schools also require you to sit the UCAT or some (less) the BMAT—a separate admissions test.

Bettering Applications

- Do relevant voluntary work - reflect thoroughly in your personal statement
- Attend Med-Soc, taster days, medical school visits
- Read medical journals and articles, be up-to-date on current NHS trends, controversies, famous cases in the media
- Consider your stance on various medical ethical issues
- Be aware of MMI's -this is the interview structure most medical schools use.
