WHAT IS CAREER READY?

Prior Pursglove Career Ready programme helps raise our students' aspirations and bridges the gap between education and employment by giving access to real experience of the world of work.

It provides a structured programme of academic study, work experience opportunity, mentoring by employer volunteers, and motivational lectures and workshops to give students the skills and knowledge they need to be able to perform more effectively in the wider world.

WHY SHOULD I JOIN CAREER READY?

No other programme of study combines academic study and work experience in this way. The programme will provide opportunities to gain a full understanding of the dynamic business world and aims to provide a structured work placement, taking place over the summer break.

USEFUL SKILLS & INTERESTS

Students should expect to be hard working with the ability to work as part of a team as well as on an individual basis.

As you will be expected to undertake some form of work experience you should be prepared to develop interpersonal and communication skills to enable you to contribute to the workplace environment.

COURSE STRUCTURE & CONTENT

Career Ready will run alongside your studies at Prior Pursglove College and whilst on the course you will develop and explore:

- How to prepare for employment:
 - Application forms
 - Construction of a CV
 - Covering Letters
 - Interview preparation
- How to improve your employability skills
 - Team Work
 - Communication and interpersonal skills
 - Organisational skills amongst a few
- An exploration of many different careers and career routes

You will also be given the opportunity of:

- Academy trips
- Personal Mentor
- Summer Internship
- Employability Skills

COURSE COMMITMENT

This is a one year course but runs over 2 college years (December to December), and you will be required to attend all sessions and visits, lectures and meetings with your business mentor.

EXTERNAL INPUT

We try to make Career Ready as real as possible with the help and support of many local businesses.

We have representatives from lots of different sectors who mentor students on an individual basis, deliver lectures and support sessions, offer site visits and work to ensure all students understand how the real world works.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

The college requires 5 GCSE passes grades 4 - 9 for entrance onto this course, including English Language.
