#### **Travel To & From College**

Unless you are lucky enough to live in Guisborough, within walking distance of the college, most of our students travel to college on the dedicated college coaches. A copy of the current bus timetable can be found on the college website. If you would like us to send you a copy, please get in touch. Students pay 50p to the driver for each journey. If you are worried

about the cost then we may be able to help eligible students, so please make sure you contact us. The college ID badge which students receive at enrolment tells the driver that they are a Prior student.

# **Financial Support**

If a student is aged 16-18 and the total household income is below £30,000 per annum, they can apply for a Discretionary College Bursary to help towards costs such as transport, food and course related costs. The bursary of £5.00 per day is paid weekly and is subject to 100% attendance. Free meals may also be available to students aged 16-18 on 31st August 2023 if they, or the person financially responsible for them, is in receipt of qualifying benefits. Students aged 19 or over may apply for financial assistance with course related costs. Assistance may also be provided for childcare costs. # Student Life, Support & Personal Development

#### **Prior Plus**

Prior Plus is our new, exciting program that brings together the many experiences and opportunities available for your son or daughter at Prior and pulls them all together in an individually tailored program to help them on their way to progression and their chosen career or ambitions. It also enables them to; be involved in activities that maintain their health and well-being, contribute to the local community, develop their employability skills, and broaden their portfolio of skills and interests. Every additional experience that a student has with us will be logged and will go towards an overall certification of a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award.

#### **Pathways Leaders**

At the heart of our Prior Plus Programme are our Pathways Leaders and your son or daughter will have their own dedicated Pathways Leader who is there to support them individually within the framework of Prior Plus. They will be the first person your son or daughter meets to help familiarise them with the way the college works and to introduce them to life at Prior. They will be there to help your son or daughter optimise the opportunities on offer and to guide them in the right direction so that they build an impressive portfolio of experiences, whilst also making sure that their academic studies are on track. Throughout their college life, your son or daughter will follow a personal development programme, delivered through multiple sessions with their Pathway Leader, which will support and develop them as young adults, widen their knowledge base and raise their aspirations. This will work towards their Bronze-standard Prior Plus qualification.

At the beginning of the first term, we host a New Parents' Evening where you will meet your son's or daughter's Faculty Manager and Deputy Faculty Managers and have the opportunity to ask any questions you may have.

# **High-Flyers Programme**

At Prior Pursglove College we pride ourselves on having the specialist experience and expertise to support all our students, but feel that we really excel at supporting our high-flying students, helping them gain places on the most competitive courses at the most prestigious universities reading Medicine, Veterinary Science, Dentistry, Astrophysics, Biochemistry and Pharmacy, to name but a few.

In preparation for gaining places on the more competitive courses at the most prominent institutions, we support our students by helping them build up an impressive portfolio of experience. This comes in many different shapes and sizes, from the chance to take part in enhanced academic experiences such as the Maths and Science Olympiads, The Nuffield



Research placement, mock law trials plus many others, to substantial internal support with the chance to gain the Extended Project Qualification, membership of our Additional Pathways and work experience opportunities.

We also have an up-to-date knowledge of support schemes at universities for high flying students, and our expertise at helping students with the UCAS process is second to none. We would hope that students aiming to apply for competitive courses and/or universities would be working towards achieving the Prior Plus Gold Award.

#### **Careers Advice & Guidance**

We are fortunate to have a team of dedicated Careers Co-ordinators who are based in the college. Our students can make an appointment to see one of our advisors for specialist advice and guidance and they do this through the student's homepage. As is required by Gatsby benchmarks, all our advisors are fully trained, committed to offering an impartial service and work to a confidentiality statement where information is only shared amongst

relevant staff with the student's consent. In addition to

individual advice and guidance the Careers Team organise an extensive programme of visits and speakers which are available to all students who would like to be involved. They are widely publicised throughout the academic year and involvement in these all help towards building credits for the Prior Plus awards.

At Prior we have excellent links with local and national employers and our students benefit from this through the wide range of work experience and volunteering opportunities on offer. Our work experience team will be available to support students in finding their placements and the experience that they have will also add credits for the Prior Plus Award.

#### **College Enrichment**

Enrichment is an important part of our students' college experience. We aim for all our students to take part in an enrichment activity that they enjoy and that benefits them as an individual. We find enrichment helps the student to integrate into college life, to make new friends and to take part in something different. It also addresses the unique needs of students who already have a specific talent that they want to develop further whilst at college.

The Enrichment Programme falls under several key headings: Health and Wellbeing, Community, Employability and Future, and Skills. There are many enrichment opportunities on offer including Student Union, Events Team, Yoga, Orchestra/Choir, Badminton, 5-a-side Football League, Cheese/Pie Club and Dungeons & Dragons to name but a few. It is possible to focus on one option or if preferable to sample different options throughout the year. We will be holding our Freshers Fair on Friday 8th September and your son/daughter will be able to choose for themselves something that they will really enjoy and which will also add to the

credits for the Prior Plus award. The Enrichment Programme will also feed into your son's/daughter's Prior Plus qualification and the more they are involved, the more criteria and the higher the level they can achieve.

# **Faculty Manager**

Your son or daughter will also belong to one of our five faculties – Adventure, Discovery, Endeavour, Fortitude or Resolution. The faculty that they belong to is largely determined by the subjects they study. The Faculty Manager and their deputies tend to deal with issues such as significant welfare or pastoral issues and to help with course changes. We encourage parents to get in touch if they have any questions and the Faculty Manager is probably the best place to start.



#### What Does a College Day Look Like?

When our new students start with us on Tuesday 5th September, the first day will be exclusively for them so that they will have a chance to familiarise themselves with the campus and have a dedicated introduction into college life. Our college day is different from school, but our core hours are 9.00-4.00 with a 45-minute lunch break from 12.15-1.00 (apart from a Friday when it is 12.45-1.30). Each subject has an allocation of four and a half hours contact time, broken up in to one two-hour lesson, a one-and-a-half-hour lesson and a one-hour lesson. Students also have two hours of timetabled compulsory study which is registered and two hours with their Pathways Leader each week. There is also a one-hour slot dedicated to enrichment as we appreciate how important this is for students to broaden their horizons and do something that they enjoy. Below is a copy of our timetable which gives you an idea of what a typical week could look like:

#### Students' Assessments

Time at college is very short so we get our students quickly into the swing of things. In the first few weeks of their studies teachers will assess how their students have settled into the course. This will include how they have performed on homeworks, in class assessments and other pieces of work. Students are then graded 3, 4 or 5. This allows us to quickly identify any students that may need intervention or support very early on in their studies.

For the remainder of the year, we use Key Assessed Grades (similar to the mocks you are very familiar with in school) to support students in identifying key strengths and areas for improvement in their work so they can sit final exams and/or complete portfolios with confidence. We have planned three KAGs in November, January and June of the students' first year and three in October, January and March of the second year. Subject teachers will give plenty of warning of KAGs and make sure students are well prepared. Pathways Leaders will meet with students after each KAG to review grades and help them plan so that they can maintain and/or improve their grades.

#### **Student Workload**

To encourage students to study outside the classroom, we timetable every student for compulsory study sessions. This helps promote a culture of learning, instil a sense of responsibility, and provide students with a platform to exercise independent learning. Study Supervisors, Pathway Leaders and Faculty Staff work collaboratively to help students make the best use of this time. If you see little sign of College work at home, do ask why. Even if set work has been completed, there is always plenty to do in consolidating lesson work, reading more widely or developing skills; a rough guide would be 15 to 20 hours private work per week. Time management is a very important skill for college students, and they will learn to balance their days between studying, relaxing and socialising or taking part in extra-curricular activities.

# Parents' Evenings

In addition to the New Parents' Evening that is held in September we are planning to hold our Year 12 Parent's Evenings on Thursday 25th April and Wednesday 1st May from 4.30-7.30 where you can book appointments to speak to your son's/daughter's Pathways Leader. We will send letters home, through the post, with unique log-in details for you to book your own appointments for convenience, but we can also make these appointments for you should you prefer it.
